Wikipedia Trending Topics

The backbone of EOW since it's inception in June 2020, is the trending topics that happen daily on Wikipedia. These topics are the main focus for the existence and creation of EOW for keeping track of society interests over time.

A trending topic is a subject that experiences a surge in popularity on one or more social media platforms for a limited duration of time.

Trending topics often evolve around popular cultural occurrences such as current events, celebrity announcements, TV premiers, social concerns, breaking news and viral content. There's no limit to how long a topic stays popular, though trending topics tend to have a shelf-life of one day to one week. Sometimes topics can trend for longer periods of time. On Wikipedia, EOW has witnessed some topics trending for more than three weeks.

Trending topics are determined by algorithms created by the site on which the topics appear. Most platforms tailor the topics shown based on it's users accessing the site, taking into account location, previous likes or searches and who the user follows.

Given that there are over 6 million topics in the online English Wikipedia, what makes trending topics on Wikipedia so important in EOW's view, is that these topics provide a valuable insight into the interest of current events, during which time they are trending that are having the most profound impacts on society.

EOW's mission is to provide a full list of trending topics starting from June 2020. Every effort is made to collect all trending topics, however as these topics are manually collected, some topics may be missed due to human error.
